The amendment to the Imperial House Law has passed the House of Representatives.

Article 2 of the Constitution:

The Imperial House Law may be amended by a resolution of the Diet.

(It shall be treated the same as any other law.)

It is a law that does not require a constitutional amendment (national referendum), and is not subject to the superiority of the House of Representatives.

If it is rejected by the House of Councillors, and if it is still different after a joint committee of both houses, it will be scrapped.

Article 1 of the Constitution

The Emperor is the symbol of the Japanese people, and his position is based on the will of the people with whom sovereign power resides.

Like the Public Assistance Act,

the Preamble is located before the main text of the Japanese Constitution.
